We have been rummaging around in the archives of Washington Co. Maryland and Frederick Co. Va. (by mail) and have come up with some very interesting and informative deeds. We fervently hope you aren't bored with deeds because we have to print them for the record and also because they are interesting and informative. We have several, but they are so long and redundant (as legal documents tend to be) that we can't put them all in the letter at once. So we'll tell you what we have found and print them as space permits. One's brain boggles at the handwriting and trying to find out what the deeds say around and under and hidden in the legal terminology. We have developed a great respect for the old Clerks of Court who had to handwrite all that language in those enormous books day in and day out in that Flowery and beautiful (and sometimes carie hard to read) script.

Herewith is a short synopsis of what we have gleaned from the documents we have so far. In

1766 Frederick Slusser leased land in Fred-42 erick Co. Va. from Adam Wagener of same County for 5 shillings current money of Va. and 1 "peper corn" a year rent - 360 acres. We believe this must be Christopher's and John's brother, because in

1789 John Slusher, for the purpose of transferring some property to Peter Fulk, gave his power of attorney to "trusty friends John Smith and Frederick Slusher" in Frederick Co, and in

executors of the estate of George Folk for 5 shillings and 1 "peper corn" per year rent. (to be paid "on Satyday next"). Does anyone know the significance of the pepper corn? Is it like "one dollar and other considerations" of the present day documents? We would like to know why a peppercorn!) And then, in

1804 along came George Slusher (who is almost certainly Christopher's son George) and Mary his wife, and sold Henry Bordon Lot No. 24 in Middletown, Frederick Co. Va. Middletown is right on the southern border of Frederick Co.
